DISCIPLINARY RULES

It is needless to emphasize that a very high degree of sense of integrity, self esteem and discipline is expected from a medical student. A medical student of today is the physician of tomorrow who will swear by the Hippocratic oath and Geneva Declaration on his professional conduct while engaging himself in the healing of the ailing mankind.

- Students must maintain discipline both inside and outside the campus.
- Students are required to wear white full sleeved apron while attending classes and ward duties in the hospital. Within the college and hospital camps they should carry the identify card.
- Female students shall wear light colored salwar & kamiz with preferred shoes with full sleeved apron.
- Fashionable dresses, shabby and untidy appearance are to be avoided. Prescribed dress includes white shirt, navy blue trouser, black shoes/white keds and white full sleeved apron for male students.
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- Raising of slogans, shouting, parading in processions within the institutional campus are strictly forbidden and shall be dealt with severe punitive measures.
- Pasting of posters and writing on the walls of the college, hospital and hostel premises shall be deemed as serious acts of indiscipline on the part of students responsible for it and they shall be dealt with accordingly.
- Abstentions from classes in groups or collectively without prior permission or valid reasons shall be considered as acts of indiscipline which shall be punishable with imposition of fine and other forms of punishment. Guardians shall also be informed of such activities of their wards.
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- Political activities shall not be encouraged in the college.



College Profile

Year of establishment :

Established as an academic enterprise of Community Health Foundation Bangladesh in 1995.

Location :

At Winnerpar on a panoramic 22 Acres land 10 km from Mymensingh town towards Dhaka, on the east side of Mymensingh-Dhaka highway.

Infrastructural facilities :

The academic and administrative facilities of the college are provided in its own constructed four storied building with over one lac square feet floor space.

Hospital facilities are housed in a three storied building having 75000 sft. floor space and a large three storied outdoor complex 38,339 sft., annexed to the main hospital building. The hospital building has a provision for 650 beds covering all disciplines as required for an undergraduate medical institution. Construction work for extension of hospital building is under way.

Besides these 416 beds capacity three storied Boys Hostel and 323 beds capacity Ladies Hostel are situated in the same campus. A beautiful four storied dormitory is presently used by the in-service trainee doctors.

Foreword:

Vast majority 130 million population of Bangladesh live in the rural area. Therefore, one has to realize this fact that the basic health problem of Bangladesh relates to the teeming millions of rural Bangladesh. Generally, rural health problem is closely connected with the socio-economic and environmental problems arising out of lack of safe drinking water and

reliable sewage disposal facilities. Besides, superstition, flawed education and ingrained bad habits help spread of disease quietly in rural areas.

As one of the member states of World Health Organization (WHO) Bangladesh was committed to implement the program of "Health for all by the year 2000". Outside the Government efforts the non-Government ones, working within the framework of Government policies in cooperation with general public are considered/ recognized to be supplementary to the attainment of national objectives in different health sub-sector.

As a matter of fact, for finding solutions of health related problems of a great majority of our population of health care delivery-system has to be made mass-oriented through active community participation and involvement. Without this kind of participation, only government efforts at community health care development are not likely to succeed fully. For the doctors of future generation, there is a need for bringing them close to the community while their education career is still in progress so as to enable them to gain practical and comprehensive knowledge about the nature, signs and symptoms, spread prevention and cure of diseases and this learning process should be supported by institution-based facilities and opportunities.

Foreword:

Community Based Medical College Hospital is a 650 bedded big academic hospital having a floor space of 1,05,915 square feet average bed occupancy more than 80% . Almost all health care facilities are available here. It has started functioning on 1st February, 1997.

Hospital has seven well equipped operation theaters, 60 well qualified, well experienced consultants & 80 mid level doctors. More over 124 Internee doctors are taking training in this hospital at present. We have 111 qualified experienced staff nurse, who are providing best possible care to the patients. Student nurses of our nursing institute also taking training in this hospital.

We have a very spacious separate out patient, emergency & pathology department. Training of this hospital is recognized by BCPS.

Many of our teachers are doing research work in our hospital as well. In this hospital ICDDR'B & Micro finance institute are running their different projects.

I believe that our hospital is one of the best hospitals in greater Mymensingh.

- d) Community Based Medical College Bangladesh is an affiliated member of an international organization named "NETWORK : Towards Unity For Health (TUFH)" based at Maastricht, Netherlands.
- e) Total number of graduates 1335, male 785, female 550.

- f) Two separate Committees, comprising the teachers of the college and headed by the Principal, namely Journal Committee and Research committee work for publication of a Medical Journal (Community Based Medical College Bangladesh Journal) and to undertake research works in different Medical disciplines respectively.

College Administration :

- a) The sponsors of the College, namely Community Health Foundation Bangladesh is responsible for providing financial support/resources, appointment of teachers and personnel and overall administrative control of the college and the attached hospital.
- b) The academic programmes and activities are administered by the Principal of the college. Besides, an Academic Staff Council headed by the Principal is endowed with the overall responsibility for planning, developing, implementing, evaluating and amending all academic activities of the College.
- c) A Governing Body, comprising representatives from the Dhaka University, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Bangladesh, teachers of Community Based Medical College Bangladesh, guardians of admitted students and sponsors of the college (Community Health Foundation Bangladesh) is responsible for overseeing the academic standard, implementation and evaluation programmes of academic development and achievements.

Co-curricular activities for students :

A Student Welfare committee with teachers as advisers supervise the co-curricular activities like cultural functions, drama, games, sports and annual Cultural & Sports week, Milad and Saraswati puza etc.

Teaching Hospital and Field Practice :

- a) A hospital with provision for 650 beds within the campus is available for clinical practice and learning of students from the third academic year. Besides, each student is assigned with clinical responsibility of health education and healthcare for one or more families in the rural areas nearby the college. Under this community based medical education programme a village represents as community ward and a family represents a community bed.
- b) Training at Satellite Clinics: Internees doctors are required to spend specified time, to gain practical academic experience at Community level, in our satellite clinic of CBMCB at Rouha, Netrokona.

Hostel Accommodation :

All students required to stay in the hostels within the college campus on payment for their lodging and food charges.

Library facilities :

A library of good standard with internet facilities is available for the students.

Common Room & Reading Room:

Separate common room & reading room facilities for male and female students are available.

Teachers-Students Forum :

At the beginning of each session a teacher-student forum shall be formed by the Academic Council. This forum shall meet at least once in every 3 months to discuss academic affairs.
